Joint Statement

La Via Campesina, The International Union of Food, Agricultural, Hotel, Restaurant, Catering, Tobacco and Allied Workers' Associations (IUF), World Forum of Fisher Peoples (WFFP), The World Alliance of Mobile Indigenous Peoples (WAMIP), International Indian Treaty Alliance (IITF), Federation of Rural Adult Catholic Movements (FIMARC), Centre Europe - Tiers Monde Cetim (CETIM), FIAN International, Centro de Estudios Legales y Sociales (CELS). To the second session of the open-ended intergovernmental working group on a United Nations declaration on the rights of peasants and other people working in rural areas: *Geneva, Palais des Nations, Room XX: 02 – 06 February 2015* We are representatives of peasants, indigenous peoples, pastoralists, fishers and rural workers from around the globe, between us representing many millions of rural people, along with CETIM, FIAN International and other human rights organizations. We have been constructively engaging in this process of the UN Declaration on the Rights of Peasants and Other People Working in Rural Areas, from the field, pasture, our workplaces around the world and here in Geneva for many years. We are happy to see the on-going process and the constructive contributions from many states and civil society organizations. The UN Human Rights Council resolution 26/26 in 2014 gave the mandate to this intergovernmental working group to negotiate, finalize, and submit to the Council a draft UN declaration on the rights of peasants and other people working in rural areas. The mandate calls for existing human rights to be clarified and consolidated with a view to promoting and protecting the human rights of peasants and other people working in rural areas. Mali: "Agroecology is in our hands! We are building it further together!" - Opening of the International Agroecology Forum



Sélingué, 24 February 2015 – Today, the sun has risen brighter than ever in Mali to warm the more than 250 delegates of the first International Forum on Agroecology hosted by [Confederation of Peasants Organizations](#) of Mali (CNOP) and [La Via Campesina](#), at the Nyéléni Center in Sélingué, south Mali. There are women and men, from diverse constituencies, among them farmers, fisherfolks, indigenous people, pastoralists and urban consumers from all corners of the world, arrived to the center in buses from Bamako and other regions of Mali ([See photos on tvCampesina](#)).

"I decided to come here because we are building a necessary movement that will claim back what was always ours: our peasant knowledge of doing agriculture", said a woman farmer from Mali, as she was running to attend the women caucus, this afternoon.

Over the next four days, the women and men of the conference will debate, share experiences and celebrate agroecology with the view to reinforcing a common vision and principles, as well as deciding on a common strategy to claim back the concept of agroecology, "beyond just the scientific aspect, to encompass its social, economic and political elements", as Gilberto Schneider, from the [Movimento dos Pequenos Agricultores](#) (MPA) in Brazil, pointed out. (Bamako, 19 February 2015) – More than 200 delegates, among them peasants, family farmers, fisher folk,




pastoralists, indigenous peoples, agricultural workers, consumers, urban poor organizations, NGOs, academics and other social movements will be at the Nyéléni Centre in Mali from 24 to 27 February, to take part in the first International Forum on Agroecology. This forum takes places at a time where the world is facing economic crisis, the climate is changing, and the Mother Earth is being aggressively exploited by the corporate model of death and land grabbing.

According to [La Via Campesina](#), agroecology is essential to humanity, since it builds autonomy and a better life for small scale food producers, produces more healthy food, provides a strong base for food sovereignty, and allows rural peoples to live in harmony with and take care of our Mother Earth. Peasant and small scale food producers' agroecology is considered to be the model of life, of farms with farmers, of food producers with productive resources, of rural communities with families, of countryside with trees and forests. Statement of Assembly of the Poor Condemns violence

Condemning the Use of Violence against the Poor to Protect the Capitalists' Interests

(Thailand, February 14, 2015) On 3 February 2015 Mr. Pianrat Boonrit, the president of an agricultural cooperative, a member of Southern Peasant Federation of Thailand, was summoned by the military for attitude adjustment and detained in a jail in Vibhavadiangit Military Camp in Surat Thani Province until 5 February 2015. On the same evening the military demolished Permsab Community (a member of the agricultural cooperative, the Southern Peasant Federation of Thailand). The community locates in Chaiyaburi District in Surat Thani Province. The community members are struggling for land rights. They held a vigil not allowing the capitalist to enter and harvest oil palms in a national reserved forest of which the concession was expired for 14 years. Later on 11 February 2015 Mr. Chai Boonthonglek, age 61, also a member of the Federation was shot dead. [Read more...](#)




"Be Proud to Become a Farmwoman!" say **Elizabeth Mpofu** (Germany, Teisendorf, January 21, 2014)(al) It is certainly not an everyday occurrence, that a woman from Zimbabwe, who runs a small farm in that country, congratulates a young woman from Bavaria for her decision to also run a small farm and tells her to be proud of that decision. Elizabeth Mpofu is, however, not an everyday woman, but the general secretary of the worldwide peasant organization "Via Campesina", an association of more than 160 independent peasant organizations in 63 countries. Mpofu has experienced on her own body and in her own mind, what it means to work on their plot of about ten hectares in the South-East-African Country. The difficulties, that she has had and still has to overcome, not only in an economic way, in the pursuit of her profession as a farmer, are at least as great, as those facing a young farmwoman in Bavaria. Via Campesina International expresses its solidarity with the Honduran peasant movement following the violent attack on the offices of Via Campesina in Honduras, which took place in the early morning of January 25th. We denote the strongest of our solidarity with the Honduran peasant movement which the Honduran peasant movement faces every day, and which has worsened since the coup d'état that took place in 2009.



This new attempt to deter the peasants movement from its struggles and its conquests took place as follows:


La Via Campesina South Asia - Press Release: 24th January 2015 (India, New Delhi)

The farmers unions affiliated with the All India Coordination Committee of Farmers Movement (AICCFM) met for 2 days at the Punjab Bhawan in New Delhi under the chairmanship of Shri Ajmer Singh Lakhwal, President Bhartiya Kissan Union, Punjab. During this meeting, the farmers' leaders from 12 farmers unions intensely discussed the current burning issues in Indian agriculture which included, the Land Acquisition Act Ordinance, NDA government U-Turn in the WTO, the recent report of the Shanta Kumar High Level Committee for restructuring FCI, and others. The meeting started with a 2 minutes silence to mourn suicide by hundreds of farmers during the current NDA government regime. The farmer suicides in India are continuing despite many promises by the Narendra Modi before the election that he would work for the Indian farmers. However after becoming Prime Minister, he expressed no concern for agrarian crisis and continuing farmer suicides. During NDA Government since May 2014, more than 7000 farmers have committed suicide. During this 2 days meeting, farmers' leaders focussed on some key issues which are of great concern and they made the following demands to the NDA government to express their frustration with this government agrarian policies. Thousands of Polish farmers march in Warsaw

(Poland, Warsaw, February 17, 2015)

Today 6000 farmers marched in Warsaw to protest the Polish government's failure to address their longstanding demands. After failed talks between Union leaders and the prime minister this afternoon farmers built an occupation camp outside the prime ministers palace and have vowed to remain until their demands are met.



Protests have been taking place across the country over the last three weeks with a range of organisations to community groups and local protest committees to regional and national unions blockading roads and government ministries in hundreds of locations. At the national level the protests are being coordinated by the farmers' branch of the Solidarity Union. The protests today are also being supported by unions representing bee-keepers, coal miners and nurses who are also on strike. [Read more...](#)



The land grabbers of the Nacala Corridor


